Effective Responses to Violence against Women: Coordinated Community Response

Coordinated community response (CCR) is an approach to ensure effective implementation of legislation on violence against women, focusing on victim safety and offender accountability and coordination and involvement of all relevant stakeholders. Since it was first developed in Duluth, Minnesota, it has inspired different types of interagency collaboration around the world and has received international recognition, most notably the 2014 Future Policy Award. In this session, representatives of The Advocates for Human Rights, the World Future Council and the founders of the “Duluth Model” of CCR will present the history and theory of this approach, their core principles, effective models from around the world and the key elements that have made these responses effective.
