Greenpeace protests against Gazprom's Arctic oil drilling was a "service to humanity"

Russia without legal grounds to charge crew of Arctic Sunrise and their exemplary act of civil disobedience

November 2013

We, the signatories of this statement, Councillors of the World Future Council and recipients of the Right Livelihood Award, call upon the Russian authorities to immediately release the 28 Greenpeace activists and two journalists from the 'Arctic Sunrise' arrested for their peaceful protest of the Prirazlomnaya oil platform belonging to the international oil and gas company Gazprom. We are convinced that the allegations of piracy and hooliganism against the Greenpeace crew are baseless.

We further applaud the sober minded and non-violent protests against Gazprom's oil drilling in the Arctic, which poses a dangerous threat to the fragile Arctic environment and the global climate. We feel that the Greenpeace protest in the Arctic against oil drilling has drawn the world's attention to one of the most controversial plans of Gazprom and other oil companies: to consider the melting of the Arctic ice, a consequence of human induced climate change, as encouragement to extract more fossil resources. We see the protests in the Arctic as an exemplary act of civil disobedience and welcome the ongoing protests in support of the Greenpeace activists and against Arctic drilling in thousands of cities around the world.

We come to the conclusion that oil and gas drilling in the Arctic, and in particular in newly explored areas of the Arctic Ocean, would magnify existing hazards and create new problems without solving the energy crisis. Governments and the oil and gas industry might use economic interest to argue for the exploitation of untapped reserves in the Arctic Ocean. Not only does the economic benefit remain questionable, Arctic drilling also threatens the ability of future generations to inherit a healthy planet and of future Arctic populations to live in an intact environment.

Only a consequent development of renewable energies and energy efficiency and the corresponding redirection of investments can lead the way out of our devastating reliance on fossil fuels. Instead of investing billions in an outdated and dangerous resource, funds can be used to tap the huge renewable potentials of the Arctic and elsewhere.
